

DeBell Golf Course Local Rules Sheet

- Barrancas: Played as a lateral water hazard. Identified by red stakes and defined by red paint. Drop within 2 club lengths from the edge of the barranca where the ball last crossed the margin of the hazard. One Stroke Penalty.
- Bridges: A ball coming to rest on a bridge crossing a barranca is considered to be in the barranca. See the barrancas rule on how to proceed.
- Cart Paths: A ball coming to rest on a paved cart path may take free relief, from the point where the ball has come to rest.
- Out of Bounds: Identified by white stakes and boundary fences and defined by white paint.
- Flower Beds: Identified by green tipped stakes. The ball must be dropped in the nearest drop area. No Penalty. A ball coming to rest above the railroad ties on hole #6 must be played as it lies.
- Interior Protective Fences: Swing and stance relief is permitted, not line of sight. Determine nearest point of relief and drop within one club length, no nearer to the hole.

Special Notes

- A ball crossing over the farthest edge of the barranca is out of bounds.
- The cart storage building between hole #17 & #18 is played as an immovable obstruction. Swing and stance relief is allowed, not line of sight.
- The cement walls by the greens on #2 and #3 are immovable obstructions. Swing and stance relief is permitted, not line of sight.
- The telephone poles by #8 green are defined as an integral part of the golf course. Play the ball as it lies or take an unplayable lie. No free relief is granted.
- A ball crossing over, under or through the protective fence on the right side of hole #2 shall not be played. Drop a ball within 2 club lengths of the point of entry, no nearer to the hole. One stroke penalty.
- Hardpan, dirt service roads and paths must be played as it lies, no free relief.
- The Rules Committee has declared that stones that lay in a bunker may be treated as loose impediments because of the potential danger they may represent to players in the bunker.
